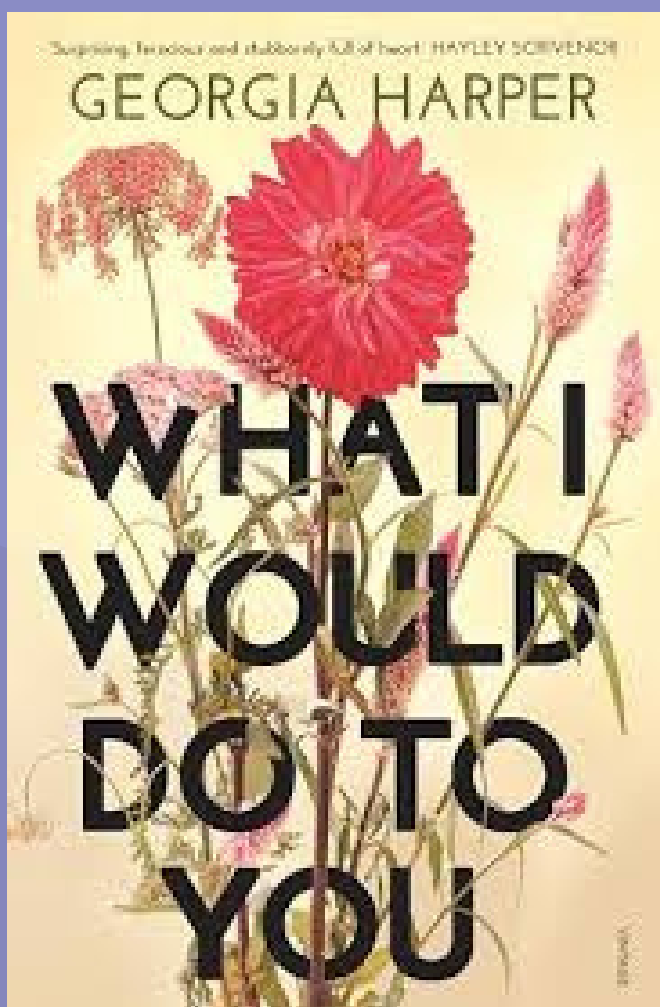


Book Review:
